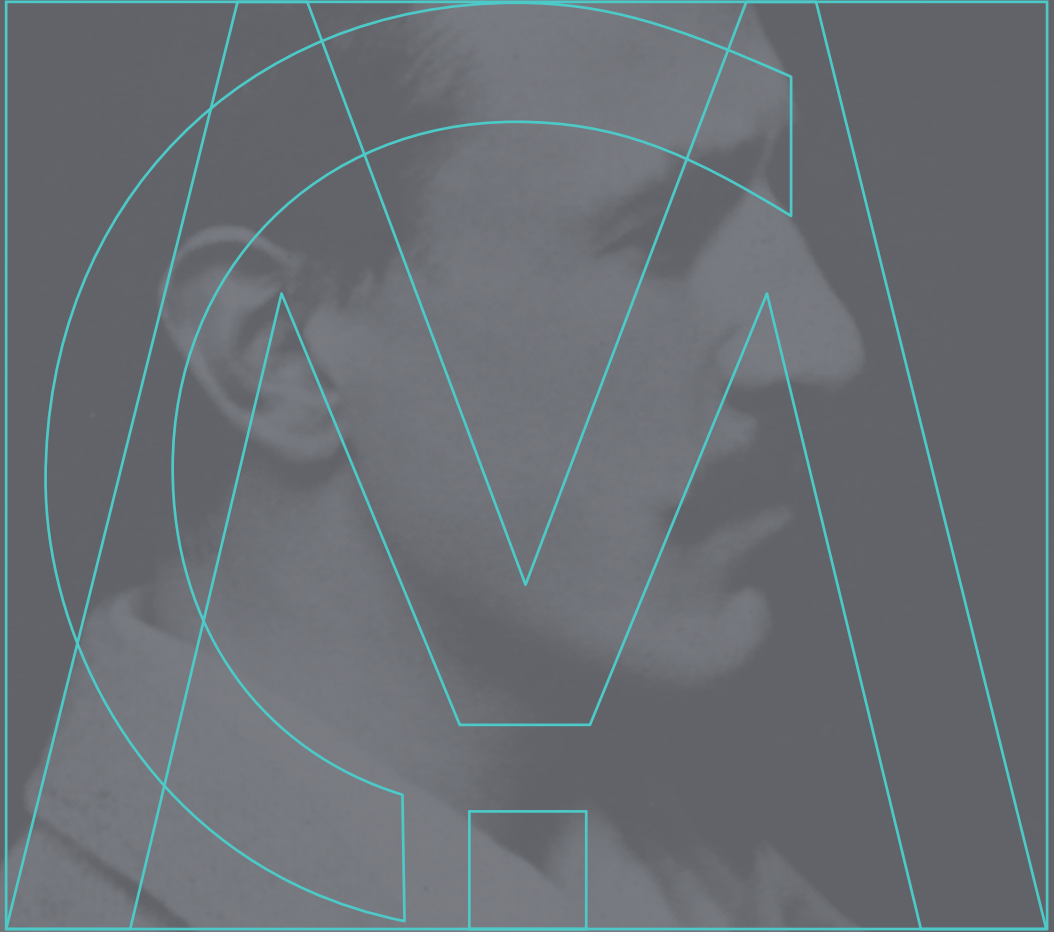

# WELCOME

## To Glasgow's Creative Mackintosh Festival 2013.

### It is with great pleasure that I introduce you to the second Creative Mackintosh Festival celebrating art and architecture in Glasgow.

Charles Rennie Mackintosh, the innovative Glasgow architect whose work propelled architecture from Victorian flamboyance to modern minimalism, is being celebrated in this festival. Over the space of two weeks (October 12 – 27) the city is inviting visitors to explore, discover and create using one of the city's best-loved sons as their inspiration with over 30 exhibitions, talks, workshops, walks and events in all the major buildings created by Mackintosh. The Charles Rennie Mackintosh Society is celebrating its 40th anniversary on 4th October and has a diverse and exciting programme of events at the Mackintosh Church at Queens Cross.

In the Year of Natural Scotland, exhibitions include artist Frances Law at the Mackintosh Church with "The Architecture of Nature" demonstrating links between her creative work and Mackintosh design and Sofia Perina Miller's exhibition "From Garden to Garment" at the Hill House, Helensburgh which demonstrates the inspirational role of flowers in her work as was also the case in the Mackintosh watercolours.

Artist Archie Forrest, a graduate of GSA, will hold his first exhibition in Glasgow for 20 years, at the Willow Tea Room. New acquisitions will be on display in a Cabinet Reshuffle at Kelvingrove Art Gallery.

Workshops will include puppetmaking at the Mackintosh Church, Japanese carp kite making at Scotland Street School Museum as part of their Taste of Japan weekend and a Glasgow Girls textile design for budding young fashionistas at the House for an Art Lover.

A study day reappraisal of Margaret Macdonald Mackintosh run by the Hunterian and Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum will feature in the final weekend of the Festival.

Food features too with the opportunity to take tea at the world famous Willow Tea Rooms and for young people to make their own Mackintosh cupcakes. Or you can enjoy a wine tasting journey with Johnny Walker in southern France where Mackintosh spent the last years of his life. But for all of us it promises a chance to learn something new about Mackintosh and about our own relationship with the city. Whether you were inspired last year and are keen to repeat the experience or an aficionado or indeed a Mackintosh newcomer, this creative, exciting festival will offer you an experience to remember.

On behalf of Glasgow Mackintosh I hope you enjoy it.
